ECON C101: There are five SLO's for this course. The goal for each SLO was a 70% success rate. This was achieved for all five SLO's. The assessment data has been loaded into CurricUNET.

The next assessment date for the class is Spring 2015.

ECON C102: There are five SLO's for this course. The goal for each SLO was a 70% success rate. All of the SLOs met their goals except for SLO No. 4: Identify historical changes in economic institutions, social relations, and international exchange. The method to assess the assessment was an exam question on growth theory, but only 68% of the students answered the question correctly. To achieve a 70% rate, the weekly discussion will be changed to focus on the SLO objectives.

The assessment data has been loaded into CurricUNET. The re-assessment date for this SLO is Fall 2012. The next assessment date for the class is Spring 2016.

ECON C103: There are five SLO's for this course. The goal for each SLO was a 70% success rate. all of the SLOs met their goals except for SLO No. 4: Solve profit maximization problems and cost minimization decisions. The method to assess was exam questions regarding maximum surplus, profit, and deadweight loss, but only 68% of the students answered the questions correctly. To achieve a 70% rate, the weekly discussion will be changed to focus on the SLO objectives.

The assessment data has been loaded into CurricUNET. The re-assessment date for this SLO is Fall 2012. The next assessment date for the class is Spring 2017.
