Honors Program Mission:

The Honors Program seeks to prepare students for transfer and to heighten students' educational experiences. Phi Theta Kappa: Student Equity money would be useful in supporting incarcerated students. If limited number of scholarships provided by the Foundation must be directed to incarcerated students, this takes away the number of scholarships available to non-incarcerated students. We have developed a scholarship application for students and will be making decisions about how many and which students receive Foundation money. This means we may not be able to support all incarcerated students. EOPS pays membership fees for their eligible students. I believe Equity should consider doing the same for incarcerated students.
